



Year 5 Computing Knowledge Organiser– Blogging

<p>1. <u>What is a blog ?</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A blog is a website of your own where you enter information ordered by date. <p>2. <u>Why might blog posts be censored?</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sometimes people can publish things online that are illegal or offensive. In these instances, the published document can be removed, banned or content can be restricted. It is important to consider what you publish very carefully. 	<p>4. <u>'cc' and 'bcc'</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> When sending emails you can also 'cc' in recipients and 'bcc' recipients. CC stands for 'carbon copy'. It is useful when u want someone else to receive a copy of an email, but they aren't one of the primary recipients. You want the recipients of the message to know the other people who have been sent the message. BCC stands for 'blind carbon copy'. <p>3. <u>What are group emails?</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Email is a great way to send a message.
