



Year 5 Computing Knowledge Organiser– Presentations

<p>1. What is a non-linear presentation?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Non-linear presentations allow you to navigate through material without having to follow a strict order.• They give the presenter the ability to jump over slides, depending on what information is most relevant.• They resemble a website, in that one slide can easily lead to another.• There will be some navigation method built into the presentation such as 'Go To', Previous, Next buttons and perhaps hyperlinks are included that jump to other parts of the presentation.	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1.
