



<p><b>1. <u>Things to consider when making a movie:</u></b></p> <p><b>A lot goes into making movies and here are a few things to consider when planning and making your own:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What is the content of your movie? What genre does it fall into?</li> <li>• Location—where will your film be set?</li> <li>• Props— what costumes, items and objects will you need to create your movie?</li> <li>• Sound—will you have sound effects within your movie? Will you need a soundtrack?</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Panning - swivelling a still or video camera horizontally from a fixed position.</li> <li>2. Tracking - any shot where the camera follows backward, forward or moves alongside the subject being recorded.</li> <li>3. Running time—the length of duration of a film.</li> <li>4. Genre—a category i.e. comedy, thriller, horror, romance etc.</li> </ol>
<p><b>2. <u>The purpose of camera angles</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Camera shots are the building blocks of film, and shot selection has a huge impact on the way a viewer interprets the action on screen.</li> <li>• There are a number of different angles you can consider using when making movies:</li> </ul> <p>⇒ Extreme close up—where an object, item or body part fills the frame. This angle can heighten emotion.</p> <p>⇒ Close up—shows the character from the shoulder to the top of the head, good for capturing facial expressions.</p> <p>⇒ Mid shot—shows the character from waist to the top of the head. Used for facial expression and capturing body language.</p> <p>⇒ Long shot—shows the full length of the body from feet to top of head. Used to show the character in relation to their surroundings.</p> <p>⇒ Extreme long/wide shot—establishing shot at the start of a film or scene.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Extreme close up</p>  <p style="text-align: center;">Close up</p>  <p style="text-align: center;">Extreme Long/ Wide Shot</p>
