Year 6 also attended a short service at the war memorial in the village and shared their poems as well as laying a wreath from Barnham School.

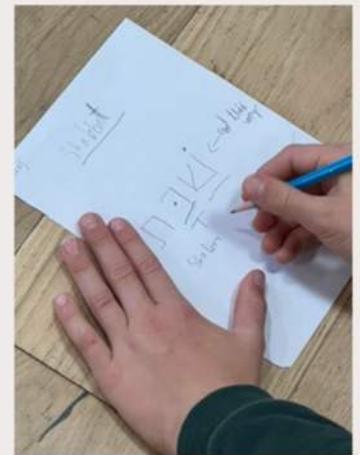
We will remember them.





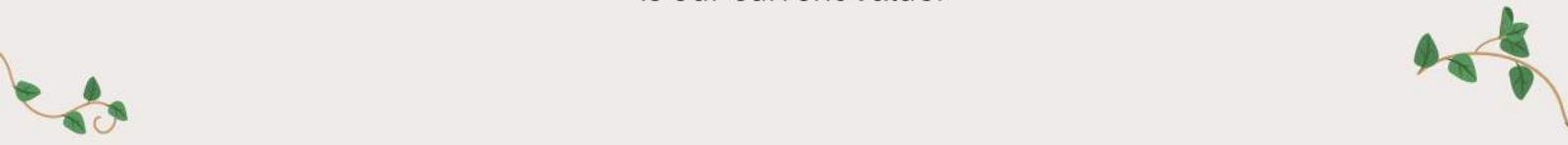


# Year 3 & 4 - Norwich Synagogue

Our thanks to Mr Hawthorne for sharing his expert knowledge with us all.



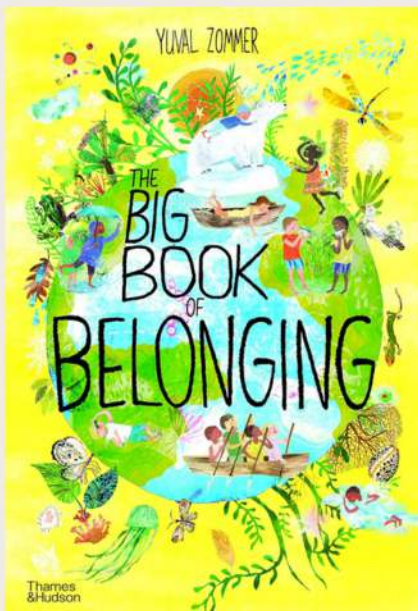


# News from Mole Class

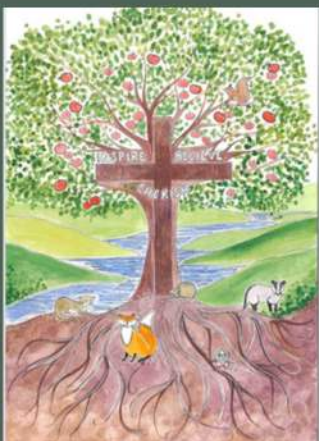
