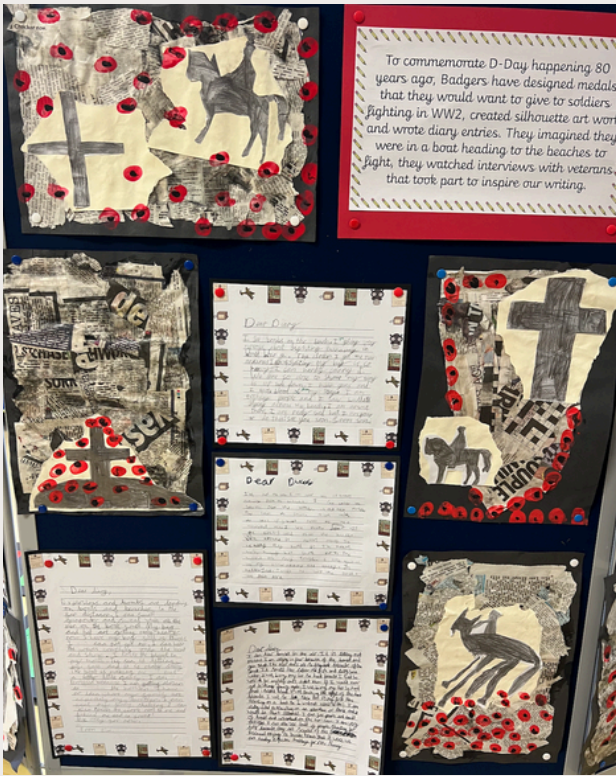

Our Values are Perseverance & Resilience

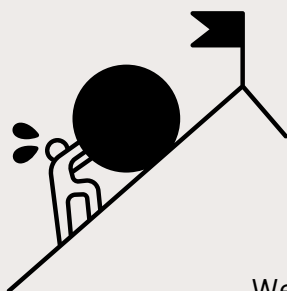
This week, our big question has been:

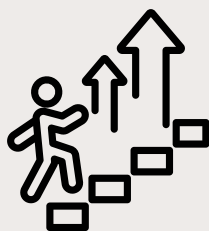
