Earth Day 2023 seems the perfect time to reflect and share some of the elements that permeate our school and contribute to protecting and supporting our fragile planet.

- Knowledge engagement visits are planned across our curriculum to provide children with hands-on, real-life outdoor learning experiences - in the natural environment. Studying rivers, animals, crop growth, rainfall, woodlands and food production ensures we all explore and learn from our natural world - in all seasons and weather!



- The lives of David Attenborough and Mary Anning are a central part of our Key Stage One History Curriculum.
- Pre-loved uniform sales and a clothes recycling bank on site help us to ensure clothes are recycled and reused as much as possible.
- Water harvesting through water butts around the school helps us to look after our plants and trees and, of course fill up the bird bath!

- Pupil voice drives our next steps in tackling climate care. Through our pupil MPs for Climate and Environment and pupil voice from our weekly vertically grouped circle time meetings, children's voices shape our next steps in making a difference to our planet. Projects have included saving vegetable scraps from the kitchen to feed our wormeries and a team of children checking at lunchtimes that projectors and lights are switched off!



- Our in house catering gives us the perfect opportunity to reduce food miles, with vegetables sourced from the farm whose land surrounds our school and a local bakery providing all our bread rolls for our pick and mix option.
- Planting!! As much as possible - including throughout our EYFS & KS1 outdoor play area, fruit trees to create a mini orchard, wildflower area, class beds and a giant log planter in our car park are just some of our planting projects!



- Children's literature about our planet, infuses our reading spine. Texts across the year groups include, Greta and the Giants, The Street Beneath my Feet, Here we Are and Shackleton's Journey.
- Our school grounds attract wildlife with our buzzing bee and butterfly wildflower garden, bat boxes, nest boxes, bird feeders and pond; all encouraging wildlife to make our school their home.
