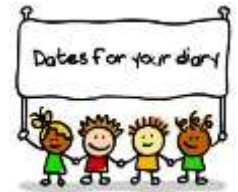


Nativity

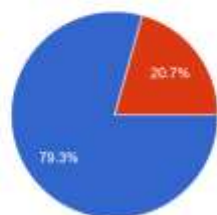
