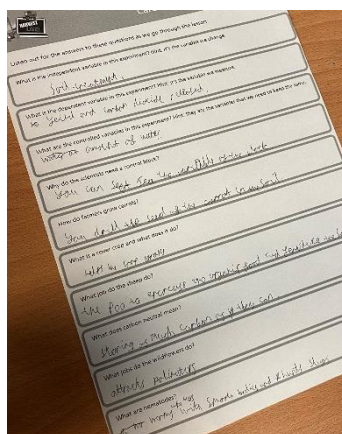
Did you know...?

- Carrots are 90% moisture
- They really do help you see in the dark
- They need 3-4 hours of sunlight per day to grow
- One field can contain about 24, 000, 000 carrots
- Nematodes get into slugs to realise bacteria and kill them so that the slugs don't damage the crop

Key Stage 1 had great fun looking at the world's largest Combine Harvester.

Did you know...?

- The combine has a spout like a tea pot
- There are three types of crop - a root, a stem and a seed crop
- The header cuts crops such as corn or wheat.
